


## WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE FULLY VACCINATED:

TCCC's COVID-19 safety protocols reflect current CDC, state, and local guidelines.



If you've had close contact\* with someone who has COVID-19, **you should get tested 3-5 days after your exposure, even if you don't have symptoms.**

\*The CDC defines close contact as being within 6 feet of someone for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period with someone who has COVID-19



The CDC now recommends wearing a mask indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until your test result is negative.

**UPDATED AUGUST 5, 2021**



**If your test result is positive you must:**

- Isolate using sick or vacation leave until **at least 10 days** since symptoms first appeared **AND**
- 24 hours with no fever **AND**
- Other COVID-19 symptoms are improving

Speak with your direct supervisor for further instructions if you test positive for COVID-19. Faculty should contact the VP of Instruction after testing positive.

## WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE NOT VACCINATED:

TCCC's COVID-19 safety protocols reflect current CDC, state, and local guidelines.



People who are not fully vaccinated who have had close contact should **quarantine and be tested immediately after being identified, and, if negative, tested again 5-7 days after last exposure or immediately if symptoms develop during quarantine**



You can end your quarantine after **day 7** following receiving a negative test result (test must occur on day 5 or later)  
OR  
End quarantine without testing after **10 days with no symptoms** present



### If your test result is positive you must:

- Isolate using sick or vacation leave until **at least 10 days** since symptoms first appeared **AND**
- 24 hours with no fever **AND**
- Other COVID-19 symptoms are improving
