- Tri-County Community College (College) acknowledges the College signed and returned to the Department of Education (Department) the College’s Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students regarding HEERF funding. Applicable is the supplement under section 18004(a)(1) CRRSAA sub section 314(a)(1), and Arp sub section 2003(a)(1). This includes assurance that the College has used, or intends to use, the applicable amount of funds designated under CRRSAA sub section 314(a)(1) and under ARP sub section 314 (a)(1) to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- Tri-County Community College has received \$261,175 under CRRSAA sub section 314(a)(1) and \$951,972 under ARP sub section 314 (a)(1).
- Tri-County Community College has awarded a grand total of 2441 CRRSSA and ARP unduplicated eligible students \$1,213,147 in emergency financial aid grants through both funding sources.
- The methods used by the College to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants, including how much a student would receive in accordance with US Department of Education guidelines, are as described below for the ARP distribution dated May 17, 2022.

Qualifications:

1. Funds were awarded to:
 - a. All students enrolled in curriculum and continuing education courses between Jan 1, 2021 – May 31, 2021
 - b. All students enrolled in curriculum and continuing education courses between Aug 15, 2021 – Dec 31, 2021.
 - c. All Pell eligible students enrolled in curriculum courses between Jan 1, 2022 – May 17, 2022.
2. Funds were awarded to students based on the total hours of the courses they were enrolled in (e.g. a 3 credit hour curriculum course meets for 16 weeks, bringing it to a total of 48 hours).
3. Students were grouped into categories based on the total hours of the courses they were enrolled in (1-80 hours, 81-160 hours, 161-240 hours, etc.).

This includes assurance that the College has used, or intends to use, the applicable amount of funds designated under CRRSAA sub section 314(a)(1) and under ARP sub section 314 (a)(1) to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- Tri-County Community College has received \$261,175 under CRRSAA sub section 314(a)(1) and \$951,972 under ARP sub section 314 (a)(1).
- Tri-County Community College has awarded a grand total of 2,412 CRRSSA and ARP unduplicated eligible students \$822,412.76 in emergency financial aid grants through both funding sources.

This includes assurance that the College has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CAREs Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students if needed.
- The College was funded \$261,175 from the Department pursuant to the College’s Certification of Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- As of the date of this report, the College has distributed a total of \$261,175 to the College’s qualifying students.
- The estimated total number of the College’s students eligible to participate in the programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CAREs Act for this round of dispersal is 192.
- The methods used by the College to determine which students receives Emergency Financial Aid Grants, including how much a student would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CAREs Act are as follows.

1. Students who were enrolled for Fall 2020 in either TR, HY, WB classes.
2. Of the students in #1, those students not in Career & College Promise.
3. There are 192 students who fit the requirements #1-2.
4. Students are awarded a grant amount based on the number of credit hours that were transitioned to online.

- Tri-County Community College (College) acknowledges the College signed and returned to the Department of Education (Department) the College’s Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CAREs Act. This includes assurance that the College has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CAREs Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students if needed.
- The College was funded **\$261,175** from the Department pursuant to the College’s Certification of Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- As of the date of this report, the College has distributed **\$71,300** to the College’s qualifying students.
- The estimated total number of the College’s students eligible to participate in the programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CAREs Act is **227**.
- As of the date of this report, the total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CAREs Act is **227**.
- The methods used by the College to determine which students receives Emergency Financial Aid Grants, including how much a student would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CAREs Act are as follows:

Qualifications:

1. Students who were enrolled for Spring 2020 in either TR, HY, WB classes on March 13, 2020 (the day of the national emergency declaration).
2. Of the students in #1, those students not in Career & College Promise.
3. There are **227** students who fit the requirements #1-2.
4. Students are awarded a grant amount based on the number of credit hours that were transitioned to online.
